

Course Description

This course equips educators with the knowledge and tools necessary to fulfill their legal and ethical responsibilities as mandated reporters. It covers how to recognize signs of abuse and neglect, respond appropriately to disclosures, and report incidents while considering cultural sensitivity and state-specific guidelines. Participants will leave with a deeper understanding of their role in protecting children and ensuring their safety.

Course Objectives

- 1. Define the roles and legal responsibilities of mandated reporters, including the steps required to fulfill reporting obligations.
- 2. Identify and assess the physical, behavioral, and environmental signs of abuse, neglect, and exploitation in children.
- 3. Demonstrate appropriate responses to a child disclosing abuse or neglect, including effective communication and reassurance techniques.
- 4. Analyze the significance of cultural sensitivity and its impact on identifying, reporting, and addressing cases of abuse or neglect.
